DID YOU KNOW?

Did you know that Martin Luther not only translated the Bible into German but also used the printing press to spread his translation and ideas widely? Before the Reformation, the Bible was only available in Latin, a language

most people couldn't read. Luther believed everyone should have access to God's Word, so he translated the New Testament into German, making Scripture understandable for everyday people. He then used the relatively new invention of the printing press to mass-produce copies, allowing his translation and Reformation teachings to spread rapidly across Europe. This revolutionary combination of translating and printing helped ensure that God's Word could reach more people than ever before. Today, Lutheran schools continue this legacy by teaching students to engage with Scripture and use modern tools to share the Gospel!

WEEKLY DEVOTION

"Therefore, since we have been justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ." - Romans 5:1

During the Reformation, Sola Fide – "faith alone" – reminded believers that we are made right with God not through our works, but through faith in Jesus Christ. Our salvation isn't something we can earn; it's a gift we receive by trusting in what Jesus has already done for us. His perfect life, sacrificial death, and victorious resurrection are enough.

Faith is more than just believing in God's existence – it's trusting His promises. It means resting in His forgiveness even when we feel unworthy, and knowing that His love never depends on how well we perform. True faith clings to Christ, confident that He has already done everything necessary for our salvation.

 Apply It: Talk with your family this week about what it means to trust God fully. When worries arise, pause and pray together, saying, "Lord, we trust You." Remind one another that faith doesn't depend on what we do, but on what Jesus has done for us.
