WEEKLY DEVOTION

“The Lord will fulfill His purpose for me.” – Psalm 138:8

It's easy to notice God's work in big moments—celebrations, successes, answered prayers. But Scripture reminds us that God is just as active in the quiet, ordinary parts of life. He is at work in daily routines, small steps of growth, and even challenges that stretch us.

At school and at home, there are days that feel ordinary or even difficult. Yet God is faithfully fulfilling His purpose in each of those moments. He is shaping hearts, strengthening faith, and guiding His people according to His perfect plan. We can trust that nothing is wasted in His hands—not our efforts, not our struggles, and not our waiting.

This week, take comfort in knowing that God's work does not depend on how exciting or successful a day feels. He is present, faithful, and always at work for our good.

- Apply It: Talk as a family about one place where you've seen God at work recently—even in a small or unexpected way. Thank Him for His steady care and trust Him with what lies ahead.

Family AND FAITH

TRUSTING GOD IN EVERYDAY LIFE

Faith grows when families take time to notice how God is at work in both big and small moments. Everyday routines—meals, car rides, homework time, or bedtime—can become opportunities to

talk about God's care and guidance. When children hear their parents speak openly about trusting God, they learn that faith is part of daily life, not just something for Sundays or chapel.

This week, choose one simple moment each day to pause together and thank God for something specific. Invite your child to share where they noticed kindness, help, or joy. These small conversations help children grow in confidence that God is always present and faithfully at work in their lives.

NLSW DID YOU KNOW?

- Lutheran schools are one of the largest mission fields of the Lutheran Church, serving millions of students around the world. Many children who attend Lutheran schools come from families of different Christian traditions—or no church background at all—making Lutheran education a meaningful way to share the Gospel of Jesus Christ each day.
- Martin Luther believed education was essential for all children, not just future pastors or church leaders. He encouraged communities to establish schools so children could learn to read Scripture, think clearly, and grow into faithful, responsible citizens who serve their neighbors.
- In Lutheran schools, faith is woven into every subject, not added on as a separate class. Students learn that God is the creator of all knowledge and that truth can be found in every area of study—from math and science to music, art, history, and athletics.
- Lutheran education is centered on the message that we are saved by grace through faith because of what Jesus has done, not because of our own efforts. This foundation gives students confidence and peace, knowing their worth comes from Christ, not performance or perfection.
- Lutheran schools value strong partnerships between school, church, and home, recognizing parents as the primary faith leaders in their children's lives. Together, families and educators walk alongside students as they grow academically, spiritually, and emotionally.

During Lutheran Schools Week, we give thanks for the gift of Christian education and celebrate the joyful noise made when students learn, serve, and grow in faith together.
