Maundy Thursday | April 17 - 2:00 pm & 7:00 pm

Gather with us as we remember the night our Savior knelt to serve, shared His body and blood, and gave us a new command-to love as He loves. This intimate service draws us into the heart of Christ's sacrificial love.

Good Friday | April 18 - 2:00 pm & 7:00 pm

In the fading light of the cross, we reflect on the depth of Christ's suffering and the weight of His sacrifice. Through scripture, silence, and song, this solemn service invites us to stand in awe of the price Jesus paid for our redemption.

Easter Sunday | April 20 - 7:00 am & 9:30 am

The grave is empty, and the victory is won! Come celebrate the resurrection of Jesus Christ with joyful worship and triumphant praise. Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia!

EASTER EGG HUNT

The Board of Parish Education is hosting an Easter Egg Hunt after each service on Easter Sunday. All toddlers through 4th graders are welcome to join. After each service, we will meet in the parish hall for a short Easter devotion, and then head out to the playground to hunt for eggs (bags will be provided).

WEEKLY DEVOTION

This week, we walk through the heart of our faith—the final days of Jesus' earthly ministry. Each day in Holy Week holds deep meaning, and together, they tell the most powerful story ever told.

Maundry Thursday - A Servant King

On Maundy Thursday, Jesus gathered with His disciples in the upper room. He broke bread, shared the cup, and said, "Do this in remembrance of me." But He also did something unexpected—He washed their feet. The King of kings knelt to serve. That night, He gave a new command: "Love one another as I have loved you" (John 13:34). Jesus showed us that true greatness is found in humble service. As followers of Christ, we are called to serve with that same love—in our homes, classrooms, and community.

Good Friday - Love Poured Out

Then came Friday. The darkest day. The cross stood tall, and Jesus hung there—not because He had sinned, but because we had. Isaiah 53:5 tells us, "He was pierced for our transgressions, crushed for our iniquities." The weight of the world's sin was laid on Him. But even in the sorrow of Good Friday, there's hope—because it wasn't the end. Jesus said, "It is finished," and with those words, He completed the work of salvation. The debt was paid. The curtain was torn. The way to the Father was opened.

Easter Sunday - He is Risen!

And then, on the third day, the tomb was empty! "Why do you look for the living among the dead? He is not here; He has risen!" (Luke 24:5-6) Jesus defeated death once and for all. Because He lives, we have hope, purpose, and eternal life. Easter reminds us that no matter how dark things may seem, the light of Christ always breaks through. We are a resurrection people–living in the joy of the Risen Savior!

As we reflect on this sacred week, may we remember:

Jesus served.

Jesus suffered.

Jesus rose.

And because of that, we are saved.
